De-Worming Medication



It is highly recommended your greyhound be prescribed a monthly, year-round de-worming medication, so be sure to talk to your vet about the best choice. There are several options available; however, they don't all provide the same effectiveness.

When comparing Interceptor Plus to Advantage Multi as one example, the Advantage Multi stays in their system and keeps treating them all month long, whereas Interceptor Plus does not. After a couple months of continued treatment, the active ingredient of moxidectin in Advantage Multi reaches "steady state" levels in your dog's system and should be very effective at killing intestinal parasites like hookworms, roundworms, and whip worms - the entire month.

Steady state means there is an effective level of the medication in the blood constantly, so it provides continuous de-worming activity. Advantage Multi also kills more parasites than Interceptor Plus - specifically fleas and ear mites, and has some activity against sarcoptic mange and demodex mange.

You can see how two medications which treat hookworm, act differently.

The reason de-worming medication is so critical – many greyhounds have been repeatedly exposed to hookworm at the race track and persistent hookworm has been recognized as an increasing problem.



Since the beginning of 2019, BGA tests foster dogs tested for parasites. If they are positive, they receive three doses of Drontal Plus and three doses of Advantage Multi, administered every two weeks, alternating the medications. They are tested four weeks after the last dose was given. If they are positive, the protocol is repeated. If they are negative, they should be placed on a monthly, year-round de-worming medication to prevent infestation. Your furry friend can also become infected when he inadvertently swallows hookworm larvae, often by grooming its feet, or from sniffing excrement or contaminated soil. This is the reason it is imperative you pick up your dog's waste immediately – it prevents eggs from hatching and tainting soil, which is important in controlling the spread of hookworms. It's impossible to eradicate hookworms once they get into the ground.

Since hookworms sap a dog's blood supply, they cause anemia. Other symptoms include weight loss, pale gums that appear grayish instead of reddish-pink, vomiting, bloody diarrhea and weakness.

Humans can contract hookworm too, while walking barefoot or when exposed skin comes in contact with contaminated soil or sand. The larvae in the contaminated soil or sand will burrow into the skin and cause the skin to become irritated in that area.

Parasites are a health issue which cannot be resolved without medication. Consult with your vet about viable options.

Keep your hound healthy with regular vet visits and consistent worming medication.

BGA Membership

Are you a voting member of Buffalo Greyhound Adoption?

For those who may not be aware, Buffalo Greyhound Adoption is a registered New York Not-for-Profit Corporation, and under its charter, BGA is managed by its Members. Although day-to-day decisions are made by BGA's officers, committee chairs and Board of Directors, certain important rights and key decisions are reserved to, and can only be made by, BGA's Members. Among other things, BGA Members have the right to elect the Board of Directors and, in turn, the officers and committee chairs. In addition, any change to BGA's corporate documents or mission can only be made with the approval of BGA's Members.

Members are invited to attend and vote at the Annual Meeting and to obtain financial reports. Directors, officers and committee chairs are generally selected from the Membership.
